The WDSF World Championships IGP, Mondioring, Agility & Obedience 2022 are over.

This year the event took place at Västerås, Sweden from May 5th to May 8th.

We are very grateful to Rasklubben Hollandse Herdershond (RHH) for hosting and organizing this event in very professional manner and a with a fantastic atmosphere! Dear friends,

I would like to review the World Championship weekend.

On Thursday before the World Championship I arrived in Västerås after a 17 hour drive. Sweden is a beautiful country, which is worth the journey. In the end, I only able to see very little off the fantastic nature around us.

Västerås is a lively city and not unlike my hometown Berlin / Germany.

On Friday we went to the event area for the Intraining, Vet. control, handing in the papers, the draw, meeting and of course the opening ceremony.

The first thing I noticed was the incredibly relaxed atmosphere. Happy faces, the handlers were full of anticipation, friendly helpers and a fantastic location.

I was able to see old dear people again and made many new friends.

It was noticeable how much people have missed this event in recent years. There was a cheerfulness in the mood that you could almost touch.

Our Swedish organizers did everything to make everyone feel comfortable.

The interaction between the athletes was characterized by friendliness, helpfulness and love for our wonderful breed.

Athletes from the Netherlands, made themselves available as protection helpers for other countries. Especially great was the moment when our Swiss starter gave up time from her training for an Italian athlete so that he could do another exercise for which there was no time in the Italian time slot.

Our starters with the furthest travel distance came from the USA and without further ado got a team leader from Sweden at their side.

This was just great and shows how uncomplicated dog sports can be, if you approach other people with respect and friendship and put our beloved hobby first.

The mutual respect shows itself above all in situations that were difficult.

Thus, some dogs had difficulties on the track on Saturday due to the very difficult weather conditions.

The chief judge, Camilla Rönnqvist, was very patient with each athlete and was able to resolve all situations according to the current rule book.



Overall, I must say that the RHH made a very good choice in judges, helpers, decoys and stewards.

All the judges were highly professional, fair and even.

The helpers and decoys worked fastidiously and in the spirit of the dog sport.

Due to the great work of the helpers, decoys and stewards it was possible for the judges to critique the dogs on a high level of a World Championship, and to determine our new World Champions.

On Saturday and Sunday, the different competitions were finally held. Unfortunately, I was not able to attend all the competitions. In many conversations and feedback, which I continued to receive up to this weekend, my impression for the event was reflected. Even if not all athletes could reach their goals, it was very fair and sporty.

The ceremonies are always a particularly emotional moment for me. When you stand in the front at the speaker's area and see all the wonderful people with their fantastic dogs, it is the greatest reward for all the work and effort you put into this organization.

I would like to congratulate all the winners of the different classes for their success.
